

Grade 3-4

This week, we spent time getting to know each other, talking about who we are, and choosing positive affirmations to say every morning. A favorite affirmation among my students is "I am Important," reminding us that each person in our class matters. We also started our IPC unit, math program, and began reading a new novel. My students researched Roald Dahl and learned some interesting facts about his life. We look forward to a great year full of discovery and learning!



Grade 5-8 (Math and Science)

This week in middle school math and science, we eased into the new year. All students learned about Google classroom and other online platforms we will be using in class and at home . We had a special guest tell us about internet safety and the school's internet policies. In Math, we began our first i-Ready diagnostic test to get a benchmark for the year. 5/6 science students began investigating matter and what it is. That will be our topic for the first trimester. Students in grades 7 and 8 will study Adaptations and began with learning about what makes the Galapagos Islands so significant. We are all looking forward to a great year!



Grade 5-8 (English and Social Studies)

This week the middle schoolers were introduced to the school curriculum for ELA and Social Studies, as well as the academic and behavioural expectations for the school year. They also had some fun reacquainting with old friends and getting to know new classmates through a series of activities and icebreakers. For social studies, the 5/6 class began learning to read and construct maps. While the 7/8 class began diving into the history of Ancient Greece. For ELA, the 5/6 class was introduced to the book they will be reading this trimester: *The Land of Stories: The Wishing Spell*. While the 7/8 class was introduced to the book they will be reading: *The Summer of Mariposas*.
