All classes reviewed in Math this week.



We have been pondering this question for weeks, ever since we started reading the dystopian novel, *The Giver*. 7/8 has been preparing for their discussion on *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. They will discuss questions such as, "Are the characters motivated more by internal or external forces?" and "In what way is the play a critique of gender stereotypes?

In Social Studies, both classes have been hard at work finishing their entrepreneurship projects. 7/8 has the added responsibility of conducting a SWOT analysis of their business. Both classes have been working to determine their overall costs, cost per unit, and the markup that they will charge to their customers.





